Stations of the Cross

We shall 'walk' the Stations of the Cross on each Sunday during Lent – except for Sunday 7 March – at 6.00pm. A different series of meditations will be used on each occasion.

Saints & Commemorations this week include:

St. David was abbot-bishop of a monastery at the place now called St. David's in Wales in the 6th century. The community was strict to a degree. St. David's designation 'the Waterman' may mean that he and his monks were teetotalers – or it may refer to the discipline of standing for long periods immersed in water, which some monks practised as a form of mortification. St. David travelled to Ireland and influenced the development of the monastic life there.
